

## **Journal Check**

This checklist is a tool that you can use to check whether the journal you are considering for Publication is a legitimate journal (not predatory). If you find any item on this list to be true of your journal and/or publisher, you should not consider it. If you want another check you can email the link or name of the journal to the librarian at: <a href="mailto:oscar@mail.sjsm.org">oscar@mail.sjsm.org</a>.

- 1. Name of journal: is the journal name the same as or easily confused with that of another?
- 2. You cannot cross check with information about the journal in the <u>ISSN portal</u>?
- 3. Can you not contact the publisher by telephone or email and the email is a generic email like gmail or yahoo. Does the phone number answer the call?
- 4. Does the journal guarantee acceptance or a very short peer review time?
- 5. Does the journal offer to speed up the publication by additional payment? Does the journal promise rapid publication?
- 6. Does the journal have less than 3 years of articles published within the related topic?
- 7. If the journal is open access, it is not listed in the <u>Directory of Open Access Journals</u> (DOAJ)?
- 8. Does the journal mention non existent or questionable indexes such as Copernicus for example.
- 9. Does the journal have several grammar & spelling errors. 87% of websites with spelling or grammar errors are predatory.
- 10. The journal uses distorted, fuzzy or stock images?
- 11. The address of the journal is fake or there is no physical address. For example one fake publisher has an address that is the location of another business or a personal residence.
