CANADIAN STUDENTS

Saint James School of Medicine is an international medical school and therefore is unable to issue United States student visas for clinical rotations and AICM. We do, however, provide students with visa support letters. It contains the name of the hospital and the length of the scheduled rotation. We are not responsible for immigration issues students may have when crossing the US border, despite having this letter. Students who are not scheduled for any type of rotations or AICM with Saint James are not allowed to be issued this letter and their application for this letter will be automatically denied.

If you are scheduled for rotations and you will be crossing the border to complete your medical education please send us visa letter application which can be found on our website. We will provide that letter as soon as possible. Also in addition you can request a support letter from the hospital you will be studying in. You need to show both letters to the immigration officer while crossing the border.

Please note that possession of those letters does not guarantee you getting into US, however it informs the immigration officer about the nature of your stay. The type of visa which may be granted to you based on this letter is a B1 Visa.
