20 Years Reflection





Science Day (Saint Vincent)

July 29, 2019: Fourth Semester Students at the Saint James School of Medicine in St. Vincent conducted original research projects in partial fulfillment of their Research in Health and Medicine (RHM 3) course requirements. Five projects were developed by student teams from the Saint Vincent campus under the supervision of 5 faculty mentors. All proposals were approved by the campus Research Committees. On Science Day, student teams delivered 12-minute oral presentations, and displayed their digital posters on screen during the 3-minute Q&A sessions. The presentations were evaluated by 9 faculty judges.
