

Obituary: Carl Bell, MD

We are saddened to learn of the untimely passing of one of our old preceptors, Dr Bell. Dr. Bell was an attending for SJSM Psychiatry students at Jackson Park



Hospital since 2005. In addition to mentoring students, he dedicated a lot of his work to research and to being an active member of the community, particularly on the South Side of Chicago where he grew up and went to school for most of his adolescent life. Dr. Bell practiced community psychiatry at Jackson Park Hospital and at the Community Mental Health Council, where as president and CEO, he helped to build that facility into a large comprehensive mental health center that advised other nonprofit and public entities focused on mental health.
