We expect many more changes to come in the following months. We look forward to improving and growing our school and seeing our students achieve success. The SJSM Executive Committee has reviewed the current school operations, and compared our tuition against other accredited Caribbean medical schools to guarantee that we ensure the most competitive tuition possible. In order to continue to provide an excellent learning experience, we have had to increase tuition and fees nominally. Despite this increase, we still remain one of the most competitively priced accredited Caribbean medical schools, and in most cases our tuition remains significantly lower than comparable schools.

The tuition* changes are effective for the Spring 2020 term and are as follows:

Basic Science Anguilla: \$8,600Basic Science St. Vincent: \$6.650

Clinical Sciences: \$9,850

The invoices for the **Spring 2020** semester were issued in the last week of October. The due date for these invoices will be **December 6, 2019**. We ask our students to please submit finance tickets to request payment plans before this date. If you already know that you will requiring a payment plan, please do not wait until the tuition due date to request your payment plan. For invoices that are unpaid by the due date, the first late fee will be assessed on **December 7, 2019**. The second late fee will be assessed on **December 27, 2019**. Please note that the second late fee is assessed right after the Christmas holiday, so please plan accordingly.

Financial Aid Process:

We offer several types of payment options.

We also offer student payment plans where students sign an agreement which will allow them to make monthly payments over a 4 month period, interest free. 
Medbullets:

SVG Auction:




In order to raise funds for the White Coat Ceremony, MD5 students held an auction on Nov 1, 2019. Thank you to everyone who came out.

Predatory Publishing:

Be aware of predatory publishing! Predatory publishing is a very common publishing business model these days. It involves charging publication fees to authors, without checking the quality and legitimacy of articles, without peer-reviewing articles and without providing editorial and publishing services that legitimate journals do. Do not be tricked into publishing with them. Not only that you will pay high fees, but any association with "predatory" publishers or journals may damage your credibility.

If you want to publish a paper, you may contact the SJSM librarian and he will advise you about the status of the journal you picked up.
